The following feature demonstration is an early developer proof of concept and does not yet represent a finished solution. Functionality may change significantly before the final release. Icons, feature names, and user interface elements are subject to change. One of our goals with Project Orion is to make certain aspects of the configuration easier to manage. An area where we are working to simplify is Style Groups. Let me show you how. With Orion, our server interface allows you to easily create and modify all aspects of your style groups. Here I'm creating a new group called Back by clicking the blue button and typing the name. Now I'm dragging and dropping existing styles into this new group. This centralised management of style groups ensures consistency and simplifies updates. As you can see, when we switch back to Word and click refresh, the new Back group is now available in Word.

The Document Info dialogue benefits from a similar server-side relationship. In its standard configuration, the document info dialogue is dynamically generated from choices you make in this server interface. Adding new fields, configuring them as needed, and changing the order is as easy as drag and drop. When we switch back to Word, the reordered language field is now first. Being able to directly manage your metadata fields and their ordering allows you to prioritise and adapt Orion so it's most relevant to your content and workflows. This is just one example of how Project Orion enables you to do more. We're also working on an end-to-end demo in anticipation of seeing you in person at CSE and SSP in May.
